UNITED NATIONS CORE VALUES INTEGRITY, PROFESSIONALISM, RESPECT FOR DIVERSITY

BACKGROUND

The United Nations Human Settlements Programme, UN-Habitat, is the United Nations agency for human settlements and is mandated by the UN General Assembly to promote socially and environmentally sustainable towns and cities with the goal of providing adequate shelter for all. UN-Habitat's mandate is further derived from other internationally agreed upon development goals, including the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) approved by UN Member States in 2015. The New Urban Agenda approved at Quito in 2016 sets the standards for achieving SDG 11 which calls to "make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable."

UN-Habitat established a presence in Myanmar in the early 1990's through 2004 during which time the agency pioneered introducing community-driven development through its flagship "People's Process", and established the first community-led projects in the Dry Zone, Shan State and the Delta.

UN-Habitat in Myanmar has attained a large number of notable achievements in Policy and Strategy formulation, Capacity Building Support and knowledge and technology transfer in several normative and operational activities focusing on the four thematic areas of i) Participatory urban planning, management and governance; ii) Improving human settlements and rebuilding communities; iii) Land administration and management and pro-poor housing; and iv) Environment, disaster risk reduction, resilience building and climate change. As part of normative activities, the agency is providing crucial technical assistance on issues related to the Habitat Agenda to its partners in Myanmar including the Ministry of Construction, Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation, and of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation.

UN-Habitat, as a key urban player in Myanmar, has been implementing COVID-19 emergency response projects in informal settlements of Yangon. However, the needs are significantly more than what is being done. In order to continue providing the urgent support to prevent spread of the pandemic in informal settlements, Building resilience against COVID-19 through WASH and waste management support in urban informal settlements project is implementing in eight townships of Yangon (Hlaing Thar Yar, Shwe Pyi Thar, Dagon Seikkan, Dala, Shwe Pyi Thar, North Okkalapa, Thanlyin, South Dagon and Insein).

The project consists of three major components, Component A: Enhancing access to safe water and improved environmental sanitation in informal settlements; Component b: Improving solid waste management in informal settlements; and Component C: Improving hygiene awareness and capacity of

communities in informal settlements. The project's objectives are: to support communities in informal settlements with access to safe water through water supply system that is built, operated and maintained by the community themselves, and to help them to prevent spread of COVID-19, to support Yangon City Development Committee's Pollution Control and Cleansing Department (PCCD) to provide waste management services to informal settlements through the procurement of essential garbage collection dump trucks and waste collection containers and establishing a collection system, to organize and mobilize communities to undertake proper segregation at source, collection of household waste and safe disposal, to provide frontline sanitation workers and community volunteers with essential PPE kits to enhance their safety, to improve awareness and providing updated information about COVID-19 and prevention actions among urban poor communities living mostly in selected informal settlements, including school students in the area and to strengthen preparedness in informal settlements by disseminating accurate information, expanding access to hand washing stations with soap, providing critical cleaning supplies to schools, and supporting livelihood of community volunteers at risk of income loss.

In this context, UN-Habitat is looking for suitable **national candidates** for the position **Senior Community Mobilizer** to be based in Yangon.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Within the framework of UN-Habitat's work programme, policies and procedures, the **Senior Community Mobilizer** will work under the direct supervision of Programme Coordinator, and over all guidance of Country Programme Manager. The Senior Community Mobilizer will be responsible for the following tasks:

- Assist the project team to coordinate with township authorities to identify and select informal settlements within eight project townships
- Coordinate with Community Development Committees (CDCs), CBOs and other community organizations in target townships to identify community volunteers to participate of the project of activities
- Coordinate with the target communities in determining mutually convenient time and venue to conduct training on IEC material distribution (following all biosecurity measures regarding COVID-19)
- Assist the community volunteers to undertake the implementation of all necessary project activities
- Assist the community volunteers during dissemination of IEC materials and messages to prevent COVID-19
- Assist the project team during support to schools/informal settlements with provision of handwashing stations and PPEs
- Facilitate project activities as required at the informal settlement level in accordance with project work plans and in ways consistent with the project strategies
- Assist with data gathering and implementation of project activities monitoring and evaluation purposes
- Guide the community volunteers throughout the project implementation
- Represent the project at the community level: as such, s/he will serve as an important conduit for communication between the project and the target communities, and will provide on-going feedback, from the communities to the project to assist planning and problem solving
- Work closely with CDCs/CBOs and community volunteers to ensure project outcomes are achieved

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Secondary level education
- Formal technical qualifications are not essential but practical experience and skills in community-driven projects (community mobilization) would be an advantage (at least two years of working experience)
- Preferably from the project townships, knowledge about informal settlements would be an advantage, women are highly encouraged to apply
- Essential attributes will be respect for the local communities and willingness and ability to work as part of dynamic project team

Competencies

- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Good team spirit and respect for diversity

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

The application comprises a one-page cover letter explaining the applicant's interest and suitability for the post and a CV with a Passport Photograph, updated United Nations Personal History Form (P 11) and copy of certificates and eventually letters of recommendation.
